In 2007 William Bobrick was convicted of conspiring to bribe an elected official. Bobrick was sentenced to a term of 5 months of incarceration with 2 years of supervised release to follow. Supervision commenced on June 6, 2008. At docket 36 Bobrick moves for a reduction of the duration of the 13-year prohibition on his ability to hold any position of authority in a labor organization imposed by Section 504(a) of the Labor-Management Reporting and Disclosure Act of 1959 (LMRDA). The United States has filed a non-opposition to Bobrick's motion.

The authorities cited and discussed in Bobrick's motion at pages 8-11 persuade this court that it may order a reduction provided that Bobrick presents clear and convincing evidence that the reduction would not be contrary to the purpose of section 504(a) of the LMRA. Bobrick's motion is supported by an array of documentation which convinces the court that he has been thoroughly rehabilitated.

The court concludes that there is no risk involved in his service as a person with authority in a labor organization.. Accordingly, the motion at docket 36 is granted as follows:

IT IS ORDERED: The prohibition on Bobrick's service as a person with authority in a labor organization shall terminate on December 30, 2016.
